WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. Mary P. Wilhite, a widow of Jackson
and County, Missouri his wife, for and in consideration
 of the sum of One Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty DOLLARS,
to me in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J.R. Sharp
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western
 District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All my undivided one-half of Lot Four (4) in Block Seventy five
(75), in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, according to the recorded plat
thereof, the same being all of my right, title and interest in and to said lot,
65 ft facing First St. & 120 ft deep

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said J.R. Sharp
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
 And hereby covenant with said J.R. Sharp that I will forever
 warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.
