Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Robert B. Williamson
and a single man his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of nine hundred fifty DOLLARS,
to me in hand paid by George J. Williamson, the receipt thereof being hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George J. Williamson
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Ch. of Tulsa, Creek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of my undivided interest in and to the north seventy five (75) feet of lot one (1)
in block one hundred fifty four (154) according to the official plat and survey thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said George J. Williamson
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
And hereby covenant with said George J. Williamson that I will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, _____ wife of the said _____ for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said _____
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
