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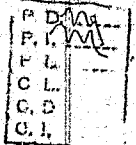

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. A. Friend
and Julia A. Friend his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Six Hundred and Thirty (630.00) DOLLARS,
In hand paid by J. J. Buck the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. J. Buck
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot six (6) in Block five (5) according to survey and plat filed of Friend
Addition to the City of Tulsa Creek Nation Indian Territory

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said J. J. Buck
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
And hereby covenant with said J. J. Buck that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Julia A. Friend wife of the said J. A. Friend for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
J. J. Buck all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
