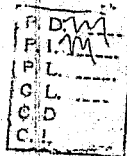

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Lizzie Johnson, (mother of Lucile Johnson deceased)
 and Lewis Johnson (father of Lizzie Johnson) and Melinda Johnson (mother of Lizzie Johnson) the sole surviving heirs of Lucile Johnson deceased
 of the sum of One Thousand & No/100 DOLLARS,
 to us paid by Jasper S. Martin

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Jasper S. Martin
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Twenty Eighth Recording District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The North West 1/4 of South East 1/4 and the S.W. 1/4 of North East 1/4 of South East 1/4, and
the South 1/2 of South West 1/4 of North East 1/4 of Section Nineteen, Township Twenty One
Range Thirteen East, containing 70 acres more or less according to the United
States survey thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Jasper S. Martin
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
 And we hereby covenant with the said Jasper S. Martin that we will forever
 warrant and defend the title of said lands against all lawful claims whatever.

And I, Jasper S. Martin wife of the said Jasper S. Martin for and
 in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
Jasper S. Martin all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
