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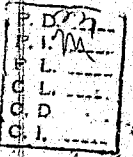

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Ira Brooks
and Mary B. Brooks his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Two Hundred & fifty DOLLARS,
in hand paid by Maye P. Curry the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged.

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Maye P. Curry
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Green Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot five (5) in Block four (4) in Hunsbury Addition to City of Tulsa, Indian Territory according
to plat of same filed August 5th 1906.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Maye P. Curry
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Maye P. Curry that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. Except one hundred and twenty dollars
due on lot to L. R. Hunsbury and John N. Casey.

And I, Mary B. Brooks wife of the said Ira Brooks for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

Maye P. Curry all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
