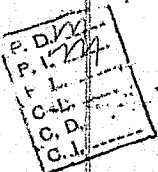

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Henry Brandner
and Emma Brandner his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Eight hundred DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Henry L. Reed
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Leaek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Eight (8) in Block Two (2) in House Addition to the City of Tulsa, in said Nation, District
and Territory and according to the recorded Plat of said addition.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Henry L. Reed
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Henry L. Reed that we will forever
warrant and defend the title to of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Emma Brandner wife of the said Henry Brandner for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
Henry L. Reed all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
