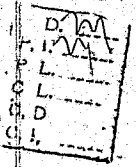

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, John Hogan
and Nora Hogan his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of one hundred n/100 (100.00) DOLLARS,
the receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged
and to us paid by Mary L. Hogan

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Mary L. Hogan
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Shubach Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot number (4) Town Block # (170) One Hundred and Ninety
three according to the "Government Survey and Plat" thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Mary L. Hogan
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Mary L. Hogan that they will forever
(warrant and defend the title) of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Nora Hogan wife of the said John Hogan for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Mary L.
Hogan all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
