Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Eveline Grapson
and single and unmarried his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Eight Hundred and Twenty Five DOLLARS,
the receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged
and to me in hand paid by A. A. Wilson

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said A. A. Wilson
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Arche Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The North East Quarter of the North West Quarter
of Sec. Eighteen (18) Township Nine (9) Range
Fourteen (14) E., and containing 40 acres, according
to the Government Survey

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said A. A. Wilson
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said A. A. Wilson that she will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. Said A. A. Wilson
to receive the rentals from the above land for year 1907

And I, Eveline Grapson wife of the said A. A. Wilson for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. A. Wilson
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
