WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

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Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Lila D. Lindsey
and L. W. Lindsey, her husband his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Three Hundred & fifteen DOLLARS,
The Receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
at delivery of this deed to Mrs. Ellen Turhipe

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Ellen Turhipe
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the County of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The Town lot numbered Two (2), in the Town
Block numbered 10, in the second Lindsey Addition
to Tulsa Indian Territory as per plat thereof ex-
ecuted by Jas. Patton

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Ellen Turhipe
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Ellen Turhipe that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, L. W. Lindsey, husband wife of the said Lila D. Lindsey for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Ellen Turhipe
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
