Know all Men by these Presents, That we, George W. Adams
and Minnie E. Adams, his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Ten Thousand DOLLARS,
in hand paid by W. E. Campbell, the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said W. E. Campbell
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all that tract or parcel of land known
as the "G. W." addition to the town of Tulsa,
except lot 1 in block 3 of said addition

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said W. E. Campbell
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said W. E. Campbell that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Minnie E. Adams wife of the said George W. Adams for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said W. E. Campbell
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
