WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, A. A. Wilson
and Jennie Wilson his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of \$1 fifteen hundred no. 00 DOLLARS,
the receipt of the same being hereby acknow-
ledged and to us paid by S. H. Jones

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. H. Jones
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Black Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all of the South-west-quarter of the north-west
quarter of Section Twenty (20) Township 11, nineteen (19)
North Range Fourteen (14) East

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said L. H. Jones
and unto His heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said L E Jones that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Jennie Wilson wife of the said A. A. Wilson for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said L. H. Jones all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
