WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, George Bullette
and Bettie Bullette his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Four thousand + fifty 40/100 DOLLARS,
The receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged
and to us paid by "The City of Tulsa, Ind. Ter."

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said The City of Tulsa Ind. Ter.
and unto its heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Four (4) and that part of the South West Quarter
of the North West Quarter of Section Three (3)
Township Nineteen (19) N. Range Twelve (12) E., lying
north of the Missouri Kansas + Texas Rail Road
Right of Way and containing 50 3/100 acres, more or
less according to the U. S. Government
Survey

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said The City of Tulsa Ind. Ter.
and unto its heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The City of Tulsa Ind. Ter. that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bettie Bullette wife of the said George Bullette for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The City of
Tulsa Ind. Ter. all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
