TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said John A. Mitchell and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John A. Mitchell that I will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, my wife of the said for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
