## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, David M. Hodge  
and Luc Hodge, husband and wife his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of four thousand three hundred (4300.) DOLLARS,  
in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby  
acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said H. C. Rawlings  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: All of Lot Five (5) and part of Lot Six (6) that  
part of Lot Six (6) being as is embodied in a plat of land  
containing one hundred and forty feet (140) having a frontage  
of forty feet on the alley and a depth of one hundred  
feet uniform width of ten feet. Also part of Lot Three (3)  
described as a plat of land fifty (50) feet by one hundred  
feet in the water between and a depth of one  
hundred and forty (140) feet to the alley adjoining a lot two (2)  
with a uniform width of fifty (50) feet. Also Block One  
hundred eighty-two (182) according to the Government  
plat and survey thereon.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said H. C. Rawlings  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.  
And hereby covenant with said H. C. Rawlings that we will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Luc Hodge wife of the said David M. Hodge for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said H. C. Rawlings  
all my rights of (dower and homestead) in and to the said lands.
