do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Jacob Schul  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: N E 1/4 of the N.W. 1/4 and the West  
half (shown on the U. S. Survey as lots 1 & 2) of the  
N.W. 1/4 of Sec 31, T19 N and Range 14 E, Creek Nation  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:  
Lot 32 - No. Thirty-two - Block 4 - No. Four  
" 31 - " - Thirty-one " 4 " Four  
" 31 - " - Thirty-one " 14 " Fourteen  
" 26 - " - Twenty-six " 9 " Nine  
in Valley Co. D. T.
