## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. D. Hagler  
and Margaret Hagler his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Eleven Thousand \$ DOLLARS,  
to us in hand paid by A. H. Ault the receipt of  
which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said A. H. Ault  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All our undivided one half interest in and to the  
South thirty-eight (38 ft) feet of Lot Four (4) in Block  
One hundred and five (105) as shown by the recorded  
plat thereof.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said A. H. Ault  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.  
I contract and bind myself  
And hereby covenant with said A. H. Ault that I will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Margaret Hagler wife of the said J. D. Hagler for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. H. Ault  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
