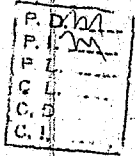

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, L. P. Owens
and Jennie A. Owens his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Twenty (\$20.00) DOLLARS,
in hand paid by J. H. Craig, the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. H. Craig
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Cherokee Nation ~~Western~~ ^{Northern}
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

lots Nine (9) Ten (10) and Eleven (11) in Block
Number Three (3) of the Barnett addition to the
original town of Skiatook, Indian Territory

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said J. H. Craig
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. H. Craig that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Jennie A. Owens wife of the said L. P. Owens for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. H. Craig
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
