Know all Men by these Presents, That we, L. W. Sumpter
 and Mary E. Sumpter his wife, for and in consideration
 of the sum of Twenty five Hundred DOLLARS,
in hand paid by P. M. Alverson the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said P. M. Alverson
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western
 District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: Beginning at the North East
corner of Lot eight, thence westerly along street line forty five
feet, thence southerly and parallel with alley line one
hundred and forty feet, thence easterly and parallel with
street line forty five feet to alley, thence northerly along alley
line one hundred and forty feet to point of beginning, being
part of Lot seven and eight in Block, No. 1100 and 1101
in City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, according to Government
plat and survey thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said P. M. Alverson
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
 And hereby covenant with said P. M. Alverson that they will forever
 warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mary E. Sumpter wife of the said L. W. Sumpter for and
 in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said P. M. Alverson
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
