through Land in blocks do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Owen Land and Development Company  
(corporation) and unto its successors and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa in the Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The south half of lot Numbered  
five (5) in block numbered one hundred fifty-nine  
(159) as shown by the United States Government  
Plat of said town of Tulsa of Indian Territory as the same  
appear of record, the same being a strip of ground  
located 100 feet North of Seventh Street having a frontage  
of 50 ft. on Elwood street and extending back to alley 140  
feet
