do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said E. D. Winters
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa, Western
 District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of the North one half of Lot Two (2) in Block
Frontum (14) in the Town of North Tulsa, C. T.
according to the recorded Plat thereof, the
same being in the Cherokee Nation, land. Etc.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said E. D. Winters
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances therunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said E. D. Winters that of will forever
 warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, _____ wife of the said _____ for and
 in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said _____
 all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
