

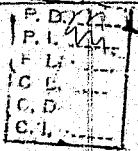

OFFICIAL FORM

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. J. Harbour
and Frances J. Harbour his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Two hundred and twenty five DOLLARS,
Cash in hand paid to them by Della Lough, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Della Lough
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Beck Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Beginning at a point three hundred and twenty-eight feet (328) feet West of the N.W. corner of the N/2 of the
SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section Twelve (12) Township Nineteen (19) North of Range Twelve (12) East, thence South fifty (50) feet, thence
West one hundred and sixty-eight (168) feet, thence North fifty (50) feet, thence East one hundred and sixty-eight (168) feet to place
of beginning being a tract of land fifty (50) wide, by one hundred and sixty-eight (168) feet long, less thirty (30) feet off of
the West side hereby reserved for Public Street and eight (8) feet off of the East side hereby reserved for Public alley.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Della Lough
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
And hereby covenant with said Della Lough that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Frances J. Harbour wife of the said J. J. Harbour for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
Della Lough all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
