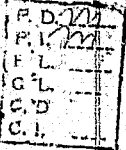

## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, P. B. Woolley  
and Lena Woolley his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Two Hundred Fifty + 00/100 DOLLARS,  
in hand paid by George W. Adams, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George W. Adams  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the \_\_\_\_\_ Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots one and Two (1+2) in Block Four (4) in Bellview Addition  
to Tulsa, Ind. Ter.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said George W. Adams  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said George W. Adams that we will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lena Woolley wife of the said P. B. Woolley for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said  
George W. Adams all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
