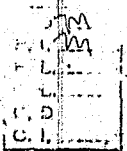

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, C. R. Howard
and Elmer G. Howard his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Three Thousand and no/100 DOLLARS,
the receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged
and to us in hand paid by Sam R. Stansbury

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Sam R. Stansbury
and unto His heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot numbered one (1) Block One Hundred & Seventy
Six (176) according to the "Official Plat" & "Government
Survey" of the City of Tulsa and Ser

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Sam R. Stansbury
and unto His heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Sam R. Stansbury that He will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Elmer G. Howard wife of the said C. R. Howard for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Sam R.
Stansbury all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
