WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, John C. Mitchell
and Alice M. Mitchell his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of One Hundred Sixty Six 3/4 DOLLARS,
to us in hand paid by Henry Stoffet the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said Henry Stoffet Creek Nation
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the County of West Tulsa, Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lots numbered one (1) and two (2) in Block Number
Seven (7) situate in West Tulsa, Creek Nation,
Indian Territory, according to the recorded plat
filed thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Henry Stoffet
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Henry Stoffet that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alice M. Mitchell wife of the said John C. Mitchell for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Henry Stoffet
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
