

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Ida Belle Northrup
and John W. Northrup, her husband, his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) DOLLARS,
to us paid by Charles B. Rogers

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Charles B. Rogers
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Twenty Eighth Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: East half of the South West quarter of
the South East quarter of Section Twenty (20); also the
South East quarter of the North West quarter; the East half
of the North East quarter of the North West quarter and the
South West quarter of the North East quarter of the Northwest
quarter, in Section Twenty-nine (29) and all in Township
Twenty Three (23) North, Range Thirteen (14) East

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Charles B. Rogers
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Charles B. Rogers that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, wife of the said for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
