Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Lon R. Stansbury
and Myrtle C. Stansbury his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of (1500.00) Fifteen Hundred DOLLARS,
The receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John M. Day
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Five in Block 2 and Lot 1- in Block -1- in The
Stansbury Addition to Tulsa & Co. according to
the recorded plat of same

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said John M. Day
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John M. Day that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Myrtle C. Stansbury wife of the said Lon R. Stansbury for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said John M.
Day all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
