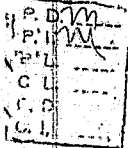

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. D. Hagler
and Margaret Hagler his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Seven Hundred fifty (750⁰⁰) DOLLARS,
to us in hand paid by J. A. Friend the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. A. Friend
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the city of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot One (1) in Block One (1) in the Friend and
Willits Addition to the city of Tulsa, d. T.
According to the recorded Plat thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said J. A. Friend
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
And hereby covenant with said J. A. Friend that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Margaret Hagler wife of the said J. D. Hagler for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. A. Friend
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
