## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Mary C. Alharton and Horner G. Alharton (husband) his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty-four Hundred (\$1500) Dollars, cash in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Robert Shipman and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa, Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: That part of lot Five (5) in Block Ninety Two (92) in Tulsa Indian Territory, according to the Government Plat thereof, so described by metes and bounds as follows: Beginning in the south line of lot Five (5) at a point thirty (30) feet so far from the south east corner of lot Five (5) in Block Nine (9) feet two (2) rods westwesterly parallel with north line Seventy (70) feet, thence southerly parallel with east line of lot Five (5) blocks 92, one hundred and thirty (130) feet, to the south line of said lot Five (5) thence northerly on lot line Sixty (60) feet to the place of beginning, northerly on lot line Sixty (60) feet, to the place of

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Robert Shipman and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Robert Shipman that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Horner G. Alharton, wife of the said Mary C. Alharton for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Robert Shipman all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
