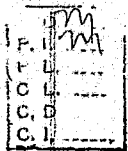

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. W. Taylor a single man
and his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Eighteen Hundred DOLLARS,
cash paid by J. J. Bentley. The receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. J. Bentley
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Four (4) in Block one hundred and fifty
nine (159) of the City of Tulsa Indian Territory
according to Government plat and survey thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said J. J. Bentley
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenanted with said J. J. Bentley that he will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, wife of the said for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
