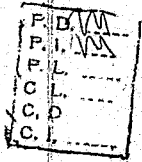

## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, L. B. Lynch and Jay Fraythe  
and E. J. Lynch and Jennie Fraythe <sup>wives</sup> ~~this~~ <sup>his wife</sup>, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Two hundred and fifty (\$50.00) DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Myron Brown  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the \_\_\_\_\_ Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Eight (8) Block Fourteen (14) Lynch +  
Fraythe Addition to Inka and. In

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Myron Brown  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Myron Brown that they will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. all being a good legal  
Myron Brown in the acceptance of this deed that there is to be no  
nothing for or as on above deed  
And I, we, E. J. Lynch and Jennie Fraythe wife of the said L. B. Lynch and Jay Fraythe for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Myron Brown  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
