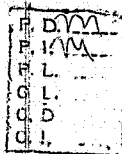

## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, L. R. Williams  
and Bessie L. Williams his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Twelve — 50 DOLLARS,  
to us paid by Thomas Pearson

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Thomas Pearson  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the in the NW 1/4 Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: of the NW 1/4 and the West half  
(shown on the U. S. Survey as lots 1 & 2) of the NW 1/4 of  
Sec 31, T19N and Range 14 E, Creek Nation Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:  
Lot 10 No. Ten Block 9 No. nine  
in Valley C. T.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Thomas Pearson  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.  
And we hereby covenant with said Thomas Pearson that we will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bessie L. Williams wife of the said L. R. Williams for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Thomas  
Pearson all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
