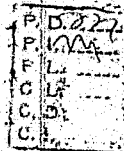

## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, W. O. Dickenson  
and Stella M. Dickenson his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Seven Hundred Twenty nine 257.00 DOLLARS,  
In hand paid by The Cherokee Company the receipt of which is hereby  
acknowledged:

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said The Cherokee Company  
and unto its heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Cherokee Nation Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

East one half of North East quarter of Northwest quarter, and South  
one half of South west quarter of North East quarter of Section Seventeen (17)  
Township Twenty (20) North Range Thirteen (13) East, containing forty  
acres more or less

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said The Cherokee Company  
and unto its heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Cherokee Company that they will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Stella M. Dickenson wife of the said W. O. Dickenson for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

The Cherokee Company all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
