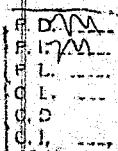

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. D. Hagler
and Margaret Hagler his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred DOLLARS,
to them in hand paid by John O. Mitchell, the
receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John O. Mitchell
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The North Half of Lot Numbered Six in Block Numbered
One Hundred Eighty-one (181) in Tulsa, C. T., according
to the government plat thereof, being a rectangular
piece of ground 50' x 140', all lines being parallel
with the respective lot and Block Lines.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said John O. Mitchell
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John O. Mitchell that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Margaret Hagler wife of the said J. D. Hagler for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said John O.
Mitchell all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
