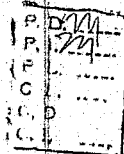

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Thomas Wiswall
and Aileen Wiswall his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of One hundred and seventy-five (\$175.00) DOLLARS,
The Receipt of which is hereby acknowledged duly
paid by Otto George Clote

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Otto George Clote
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Reels Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 130 ft. south and 30 ft. west of
the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner between sec's 11 and 12, T 19 N
R 12 E, then west 140 ft, thence south 50 ft, thence
east 140 ft, thence north 50 ft to point of beginning
being lot ⁽²⁾ three in Block (1) one River Find Addition to
Tulsa cl. 5.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Otto George Clote
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Otto George Clote that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. Except oil and gas lease
held by Geo W. Barnes Jr.

And I, Aileen Wiswall wife of the said Thomas Wiswall for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Otto George
Clote all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
