WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, O. H. Eysenbach
and Bessie L. Eysenbach and Ethel Davis and Samuel L. Davis her husband
of the sum of Six Thousand DOLLARS,
The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. A. Friend and F. M. Buel
and unto their heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Sebek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Eight (8) in Block One Hundred and Nine (109) in the
city of Tulsa
subject to a mortgage of \$1750 and interest payable to the
Big Go Lumber Co. due September 1907. and taxes
for the year 1906 amounting to \$68.82

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said J. A. Friend and F. M. Buel
and unto their heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. A. Friend and F. M. Buel that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bessie L. Eysenbach wife of the said O. H. Eysenbach for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. A. Friend and
F. M. Buel all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
