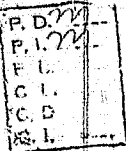

## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Erastus H. George  
and Lizzie George his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of sixteen hundred (\$1600.00) DOLLARS,  
to us paid by J. W. Bottorff of Tulsa Indian  
Territory

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said J. W. Bottorff  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the city of Tulsa, Creek Nation  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all of the Northern half of Lot two (2) in Block One  
hundred forty (140) being one hundred forty feet in length  
and fifty feet in width thru out its entire length,  
in the said city of Tulsa, Creek Nation, District  
and Territory

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said J. W. Bottorff  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.  
And hereby covenant with said J. W. Bottorff that we will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lizzie George wife of the said Erastus H. George for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. W.  
Bottorff all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
