do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Mrs. W. Y. Williamson
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the _____ Western

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Mrs. W. Y. Williamson
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant I with said Mrs. W. Y. Williamson that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. It being agreed by Mrs. W. Y.
Williamson in the acceptance of this deed that there is no selling price
And I, E. J. Lynch and Jennie Forsythe wife of the said C. B. Lynch and Jay Forsythe for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Mrs. W. Y.
Williamson all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
