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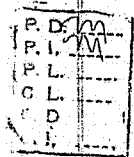

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, S. K. Williams and Bessie L. Williams his wife ~~his wife~~, for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve <sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> DOLLARS, to us paid by E. N. Mathis

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said E. N. Mathis and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: in the NE 1/4 of the N. W. 1/4, and the west half (shown on the U. S. Survey, as lots 1 & 2) of the N. W. 1/4 of Sec 31 T. 19 N. Range 14 E. Creek nation Western District of the Indian Territory, town Lot 1, section Block 24 no. twenty four with the town of valley I.T. also "12 Twelve & six

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said E. N. Mathis and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging. And hereby covenant with said E. N. Mathis that we will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bessie L. Williams wife of the said S. K. Williams for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said E. N. Mathis
