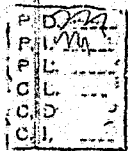

OFFICIAL FORM

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, George Stees
and Frances B. Stees his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Fourteen Hundred DOLLARS,
20 me in hand paid by R. C. Rebholz and H. O. Long receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said R. C. Rebholz and H. O. Long
and unto their heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots one (1) and two (2) in Block Three (3) of Friend and Gillette addition to the
City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, as shown by the Recorded Plat thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said R. C. Rebholz and H. O. Long
and unto their heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said R. C. Rebholz and H. O. Long that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Frances B. Stees wife of the said George Stees for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
R. C. Rebholz and H. O. Long all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
