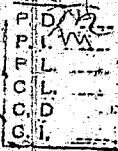

OFFICIAL FORM

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Chamney A. Owen
and Mary Owen his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) DOLLARS,
receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said The Tulsa Vitreous Brick Company
and unto its ^{successors} heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: Beginning at the south east (S.E.) corner of North east (N.E.)
Quarter of North West (N.W.) Quarter of South East Quarter (S.E.) of North West (N.W.) Quarter of Section Two (2) thence
west sixty eight feet (68), thence north one hundred sixty five (165) feet, thence east sixty eight (68) feet, thence south
to point of beginning. Also beginning at the North East (N.E.) corner of South West (S.W.) Quarter, North East (N.E.) Quarter of South
East (S.E.) Quarter of North West (N.W.) Quarter of Section Two (2) thence west one hundred sixty five (165) feet, thence south
sixty eight (68) feet, thence east one hundred sixty five (165) feet thence north to point of beginning all in Sup.
Division (12) North Range Twelve (12) East.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said The Tulsa Vitreous Brick Company
and unto its ^{successors} heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Tulsa Vitreous Brick Company that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mary Owen wife of the said Chamney A. Owen for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Tulsa
Vitreous Brick Company all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
