WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Lon R. Stensberg and Myrtle C. Stensberg,
and John N. Day and Katherine M. Day, his wife, for and in consideration
 of the sum of Six hundred seventy five DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Henry Lydal
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
 District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Two (2) and Lot (3) thru in block Five (5) in Stensberg
addition to City of Tulsa, I. T. according to the recorded plat thereof.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Henry Lydal
 and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Henry Lydal that we will forever
 warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Myrtle C. Stensberg wife of the said Lon R. Stensberg

And I, Katherine M. Day wife of the said John N. Day for and
 in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

Henry Lydal all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
