Jensen, Notary Public, within and for the Western Judicial District of the Indian Territory, personally appeared Charles Wilson, of Muskogee Indian Territory, who being by me first duly sworn, depose and say, that he is a practicing attorney at Muskogee, Indian Territory; that he was acquainted with William Flattery during his life time; that said William Flattery departed this life some about the 16th day of July 1905; that during the last two or three years of his life he cohabited with an Indian woman by the name of Lawrence Flattery; but that said William Flattery and Lawrence Flattery both stated in his presence that they were not legally married; that Lawrence Flattery regarded this life as or about the 1st day of January, 1907 and that from the cohabitation of said William Flattery and Lawrence Flattery there were no children born; further depose and say not.
