General Warranty Deed.

This Indenture, made and entered into this 16<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1900—  
by and between Arthur Primes as sole heir of Hettie Koifer, deceased, of Broken  
Arrow, I.T. party of the first part, and John D. Dearstone of Broken  
Arrow, I.T. party of the second part.

Witnesseth. That the said party of the first part, for and in consider-  
ation of the sum of seven hundred and fifty (\$750.00) dollars, in hand-  
paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does fully grant, bargain, sell  
convey and confirm unto said party of the second part the following described  
real estate and premises situate in Creek Nation, and within the limits of  
the Indian Territory, to wit: The Northwest quarter of Section Ten (10), Township  
Nineteen (19) North, Range Fourteen (14) East, together with all the improve-  
ments thereon, and the appurtenances and immunitiess thereto belonging or in  
any wise appertaining, and warrant the title to the same; and covenant with  
second party that I am of lawful age, and single and unmarried.

To have and to hold the said lands unto the said party of the second  
part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
