This Indenture, Made this 22nd day of December A.D. 1902, between J. H. Shipp, a single man of Oklahoma County, in the Territory of Oklahoma, party of the first part, and Robert Galbreath, of Oklahoma County, in the Territory of Oklahoma, party of the second part,

Witnesseth, That said party of the first part in consideration of the sum of Twenty-seven and 5/100 —————— Dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, doth these presents grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, all the following described real estate, situated —

(Part of) Lot Two (2) in Block Eight (8), in the town of Red Rock, Muscogee (Creek) Nation Indian Territory, described as follows; to wit: Beginning at a point on the East line of said lot Two (2) Twenty-five (25) feet north of the south east corner of said lot, thence West on a line parallel with the south line of said lot One hundred and forty (140) feet to alley, thence North Twenty-five feet on West line of said lot to a point Fifty (50) feet north of the South-west corner of said lot; thence East on a line parallel to South line of said lot to the East line thereof; thence South on East line of said lot to place of beginning, being 25+140 feet.

To Have and to Hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining forever.

Party of the first part for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that at the time of the delivery of these presents he is lawfully seized in his own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance in fee simple, of, and in all and singular the above granted and described premises, with all the appurtenances, that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former and other grants, titles, charges, estates, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature or kind soever; and that he will warrant and forever defend the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, against said party of the first part his heirs, and all and every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
