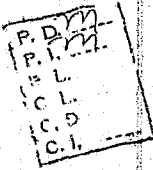

In accordance with the regulations approved by the Secretary of the Interior, May 12, 1904, in conformity to the provisions of the Act of Congress approved April 21, 1904, (33 Stat. 204), I have made a full investigation in connection with the application of Emily B. Measles a citizen by blood of the Cherokee Nation, for the removal of the restrictions upon the alienation of her allotment (except her homestead), described as follows: The North-west (NW 1/4) Quarter of the North-west (NW 1/4) Quarter of the South-east (SE 1/4) Quarter of Section Thirty (30), Township Twenty-one (21) North, Range Fourteen (14) East of the Indian Base and Meridian, and on the result of that investigation, satisfied that the removal of the restrictions as to the sale of the above described lands will be for the best interests of the allottee, and I so recommend.

The approval of this certificate does not in any manner determine the right of the allottee to any particular tract of land.
