I know all men by these presents:

That, whereas, on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1906, the United States Court for the Western District of the Indian Territory, sitting in Probate at Tulsa, in the District and Territory aforesaid, duly made and entered an order and judgment, authorizing, ordering and directing the undersigned as guardian and curator of the estate of George C. Stevenson, a minor, to sell the following real estate of said minor, as particularly described in the order of sale, to wit: The South Half of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, and the North Half of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter and the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section Seven (7), in Township Twenty-Two (22) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, and the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section Fifteen (15), in Township Twenty-Two (22) North, Range Twelve (12) East, and the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of the South east Quarter of Section Twenty-eight (28), in Township Twenty (20) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, situated in the Cherokee Nation in the Western District of the Indian Territory and the Twenty-Eighth (28<sup>th</sup>) Recording District thereof and containing Ninety (90) acres more or less, according to Government Survey, the same being an undivided one-half interest therein,

And whereas, in pursuance of said order of sale, said lands were duly appraised by three disinterested householders of the Western District of the Indian Territory at the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty (\$350.00) Dollars, and a statement of their said appraisement was duly made out and delivered to the undersigned as such guardian and curator aforesaid and by him duly filed in the office of the Clerk of said Court;
