T., Creek Nation, Western District, of the Indian Territory, for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar and other good and valuable considerations (\$1.00) to me paid by Bradley Realty Bank and Trust Company, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, I remise, release, sell, quit claim, and convey unto the said Bradley Realty Bank and Trust Company its successors, heirs and assigns, all the right, title, claims and demand, I have in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land, lying and being situate in the Western District, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, to-wit:

The east half of the south west quarter and the south west quarter of the south west quarter of section thirty five and the north west quarter of the north east quarter of section thirty two (32) Township nineteen (19) north Range twelve (12) east of the Indian Base and Meridian of the Indian Territory and according to the Government Survey thereof, being the allotment of Annie Bishop my deceased sister.

To have and to hold the same, with all the rights, immunities, privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the said Bradley Realty Bank and Trust Company, heirs and assigns, forever; so that neither the said Frederick Bishop or Perryman, nor his heirs, nor any other person or persons for him or in his name or behalf, shall or will hereafter claim or demand any right or title to the aforesaid premises or any part thereof, but they and every one of them shall, by these presents, be excluded and forever barred.
