Legue Perryman, being first duly sworn, on oath deposes and says; that he is 68 years of age, a resident of Tulsa, Indian Territory, and a member of the Creek Tribe of Indians, of which he was the chief for a number of years; that he was well well acquainted with Narcha Scott a Creek citizen, opposite roll number 6873, during her life time; that she died on the 29th day of September, 1899, a widow, leaving her two sons, Andy and Sunday Scott, also Creek citizens, opposite roll numbers 3966 and 6872 respectively; that Andy Scott and Nora Perryman were married on August 18, 1897; that there was born of this marriage three children, Ida Scott, opposite roll number 9423, who died October 2, 1901; Lou Scott, opposite roll number 3968, who died May 9, 1900; and Nancy Scott, not enrolled, who died at the age of eight months on June 2, 1903; that Andy Scott departed this life on January 2, 1903.

This affiant further states that all of the descendants herein mentioned, except the said child Nancy, died in possession of allotments in the Creek Nation or were entitled to allotments which would fall to their heirs at law.

This affiant further states that Sunday Scott, herein mentioned, is the only living blood relative of any of the descendants herein mentioned, and that Nora Perryman Scott, now Nora Scott Burgess, is the only wife of the said Andy Scott, deceased.
