This Indenture, by and between the Union Trust Company, Trustee (an Indian Territory corporation) of Tulsa, Indian Territory, party of the first part, and Clarence Dearman, party of the second part,

Witnesseth:—That, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty 00/100 Dollars (\$50.00), to it in hand paid, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the party of the first part has this day bargained and sold, and does by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey, unto the party of the second part the following described real estate situated in the Western District of Indian Territory, to wit:

Lots No's One (1) and Two (2) in Block Twelve (12) in Dawson, Ind. Ter. as per amended plat thereof, together with all the tenements and hereditaments hereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining.

To Have and to Hold the same unto the party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever.

And the party of the first part hereby covenants to and with the party of the second part that it, and its successors and assigns, will forever warrant and defend the title to the aforesaid premises in and to the party of the second part, and his heirs and assigns, against the lawful claims of all parties whomsoever.

In Witness Whereof, the party of the first part has caused these presents to be executed in its behalf by its proper officers, and the seal of the corporation hereto affixed, by authority of its board of directors and by-laws, this 2nd day of April 1907.
