Sir:

On November 9, 1906 (Land 94583), the Indian Office transmitted your report dated October 24, 1906, in the matter of the application of Rachel Perryman, a citizen by blood of the Creek Nation, for permission to unrestrictedly alienate 10 acres of land inherited by her from the estate of her deceased husband, George B. Perryman, for townsite purposes, at Tulsa, Ind. T. in accordance with the provisions of the acts of Congress approved March 3, 1903 (32 stat., 482), and June 21, 1906 (34 stat., 325).

The land covered by this application is described as the S.E. 1/4 of the N.W. 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of section 12, T. 19 N. R. 12 E., containing 10 acres.

The applicant is a full-blood Creek Indian of a limited education and unable to speak the English Language. She has property valued at \$70,000 and relies to a great extent upon the judgment of her daughters, who are well educated and wives of white men.

You recommend that said Rachel Perryman be permitted to sell the 10-acre tract herein described without restriction.

The Indian Office concurs in your recommendation, a copy of its letter is enclosed.

It appears to be to the best interests of the applicant to dispose of the land in question. Said application is hereby granted.
